

IN MEMORIAM

Johnston Price (July 21, 1954 — Nov. 27, 2017) had a lifelong interest in community education and community development. Born in Belfast in the years before the conflict in Northern Ireland, he eventually forbore the insular and backward-looking identity of the Protestant community into which he was born, opting instead for an outward-facing and left-leaning Irish identity. He was committed to “a radical increase in human freedom” based on “continuing self-realization,” through education, self-awareness, the taking of personal and social responsibility, and the development of an integrated identity. These values are reflected in his work and interests, seeking to enhance the conditions and prospects of working class communities and other disadvantaged minorities and capturing their experiences. Johnston was also a lifelong fisherman, golfer, walker, reader and Everton supporter. He is survived by his partner, Maggie Pierce, and his son, Fionn Pierce Price.
